

Visiting Guernsey

The Bailiwick of Guernsey is open to visitors from the Common Travel Area (CTA) includes the UK, the Bailiwick of Jersey, the Isle of Man and the Republic of Ireland. Visitors who are fully vaccinated* plus 14 days will come in via the blue channel, we strongly recommend that these visitors take a PCR or lateral flow test before travelling to the Bailiwick.

On arrival you will be given lateral flow tests to self-test during your visit (from 3rd August). There is no isolation requirement.

If travelling into the Bailiwick from anywhere outside the CTA, the current country category isolation and testing requirements apply. If you have been outside the CTA in the 14 days before you arrive in the Bailiwick then the country category applies regardless of your vaccination status.

Visitors who are fully vaccinated* plus 14 days will come in via the blue channel with no need to test or isolate on arrival.



Visitors who are not fully vaccinated* will test on arrival and isolate depending on the prevalence rate of where they have travelled from.



Children aged 11 and under will assume the vaccination status of their parents. Those aged between 12 and 17 will need a test on arrival and to self-isolate until receipt of a negative result then passive follow up until receipt of a negative day 7 test.



We strongly recommend that visitors take a PCR or lateral flow test before travelling to the Bailiwick.



No need to self-isolate when you return to the CTA.

*An MHRA or EMA approved vaccine, administered in the CTA, with the appropriate certification.
