*Immunised as part of Phase 1 and 2 of the COVID-19 vaccination programme as they fulfilled JCVI criteria clinically for vaccination




Recent JCVI recommendations

- ▶ Second dose for 16 and 17 year olds
- ▶ Boosting for 40-49 year olds

Population	One dose	Two doses	Total: at least one dose	Booster dose
Whole Population	4%	77%	81%	
Over 18	2%	92%	94%	
Over 50	1%	97%	98%	40%
16 and 17 years olds	49%	31*%	80%	
12 to 15 years olds	49%	0%	49%

COVID-19 Face Coverings

When someone with COVID-19 breathes, speaks, coughs or sneezes, they release particles (droplets and aerosols) which may contain the virus that causes COVID-19. These particles can be breathed in by another person.


Covering the nose and mouth will reduce the spread of droplets and aerosols carrying the virus by limiting the amount of the virus being released when a person talks and breathes.
